SPECIAL CALLED MEETING  
July 22, 2024**

**I.** There was a special called meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Cumming on Monday, July 22, 2024, at 6:00 P.M., at City Hall in Cumming, Georgia. The Mayor and all Council Members were properly notified as required by law and all were present with the exception of Mayor Brumbalow. Mayor Pro-Tem Christopher Light presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order.

**II. Pledge to the Flag:** Mayor Pro-Tem Christopher Light led everyone in the pledge to the American flag and asked City Administrator Phil Higgins to deliver the invocation.

**III. Consider Agenda for Adoption:** A motion was made by Susie Carr, and seconded by Joey Cochran to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried 4-0.

**IV. Old Business- A. Administration: 1. Consider Revised Intergovernmental Agreement with Forsyth County- SPLOST IX:** City Attorney Kevin Tallant reported that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners voted to deny the previously agreed upon intergovernmental agreement at their Thursday, July 18, 2024 meeting. The revised Intergovernmental Agreement raised the projected total collections from \$354,131,406.00 to \$383,800,894.00 while reducing the city proceeds split from 92.09% (county) and 7.91% (city) to 93.78% (county) and 6.22% (city). This would reduce the City Projects to \$17,387,601 for Roads, streets, bridges sidewalks, and parking and \$4,622,020.00 for Park and Recreation. After some discussion, a motion was made by Jason Evans and seconded by Joey Cochran to approve the revised Intergovernmental Agreement with Forsyth County on SPLOST IX. The motion carried 4-0.
